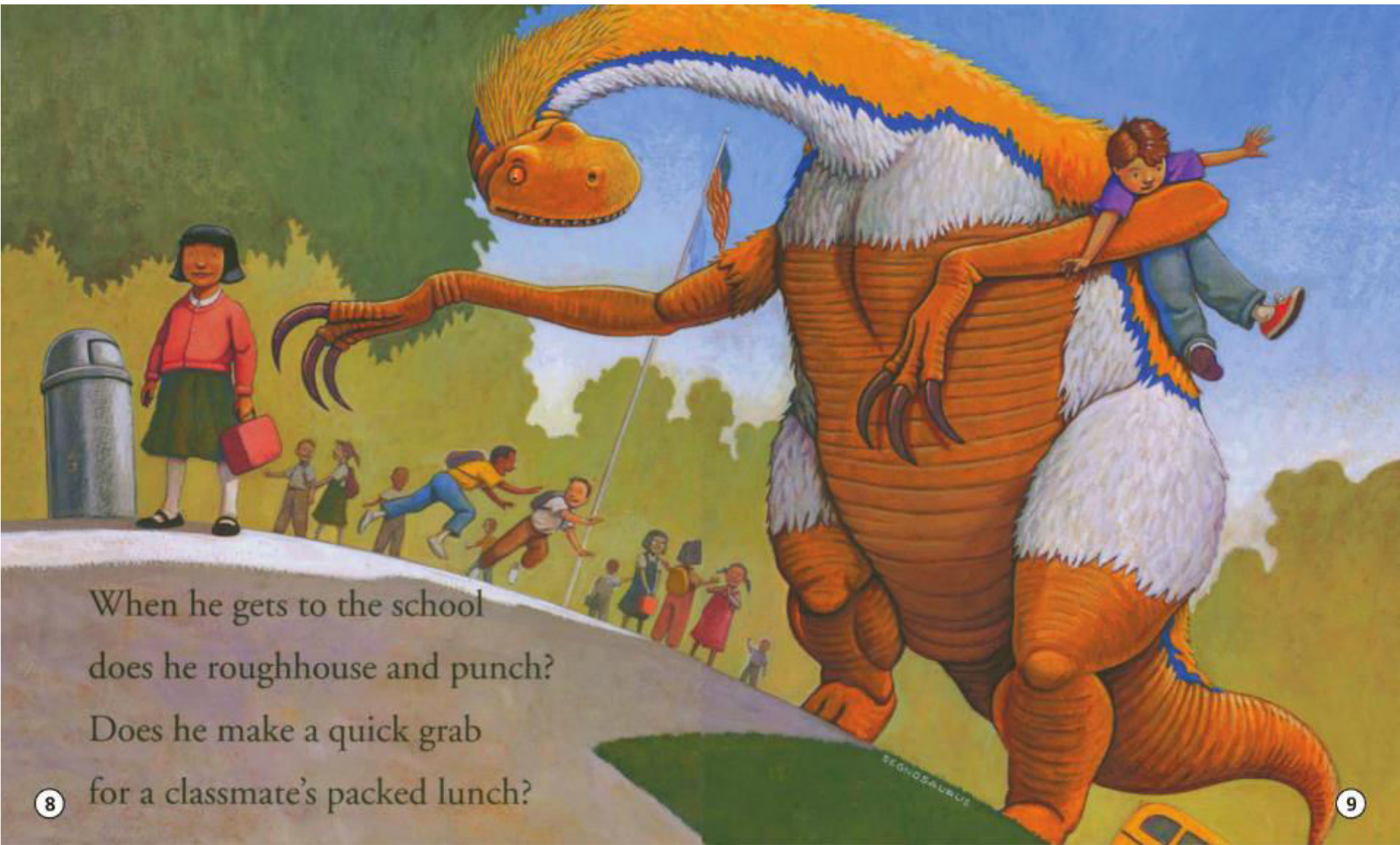


Does he drag his long tail?

Is he late for the bus?

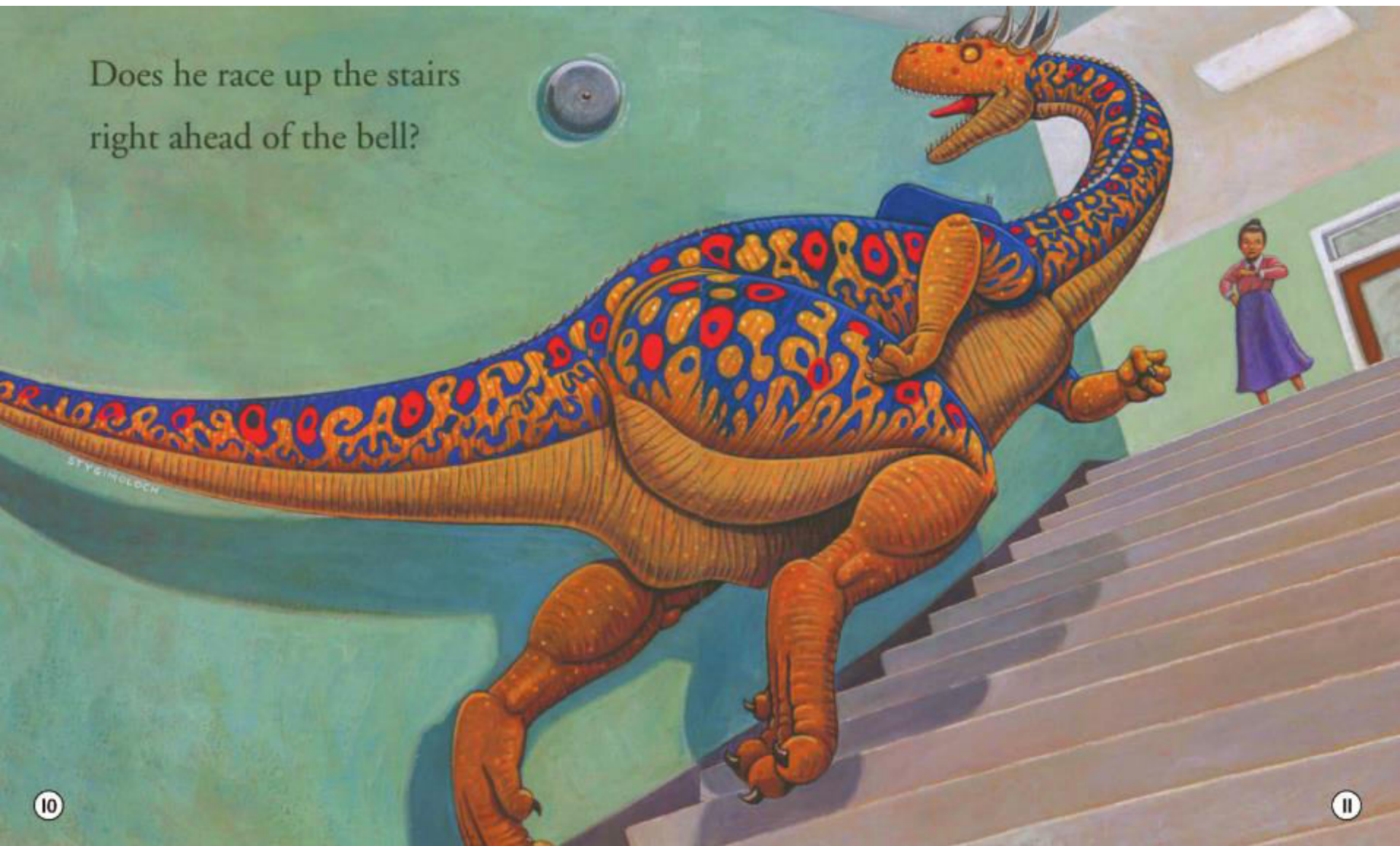
Does he stomp all four feet?

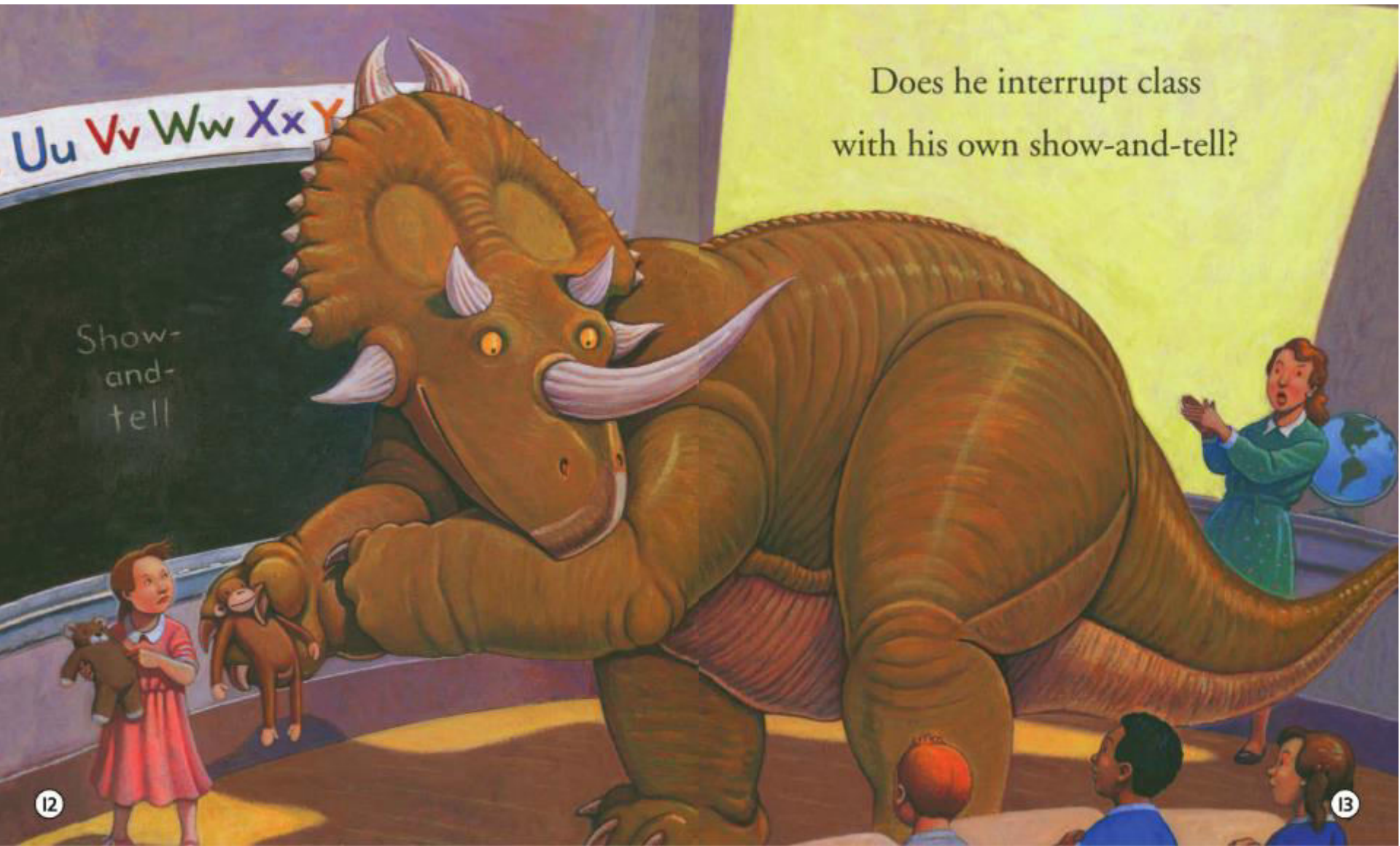
Does he make a big fuss?

right ahead of the bell?

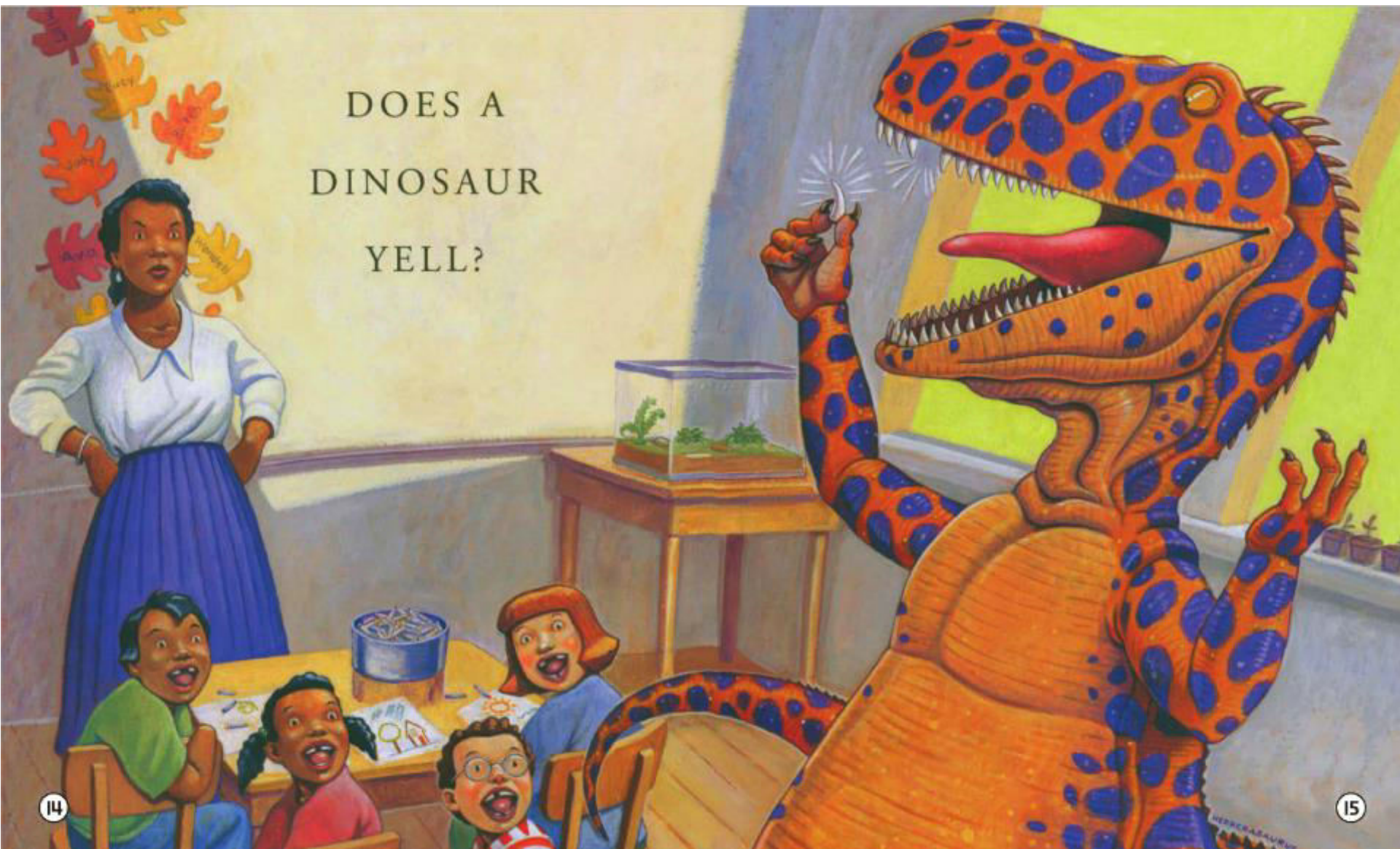





Does he interrupt class

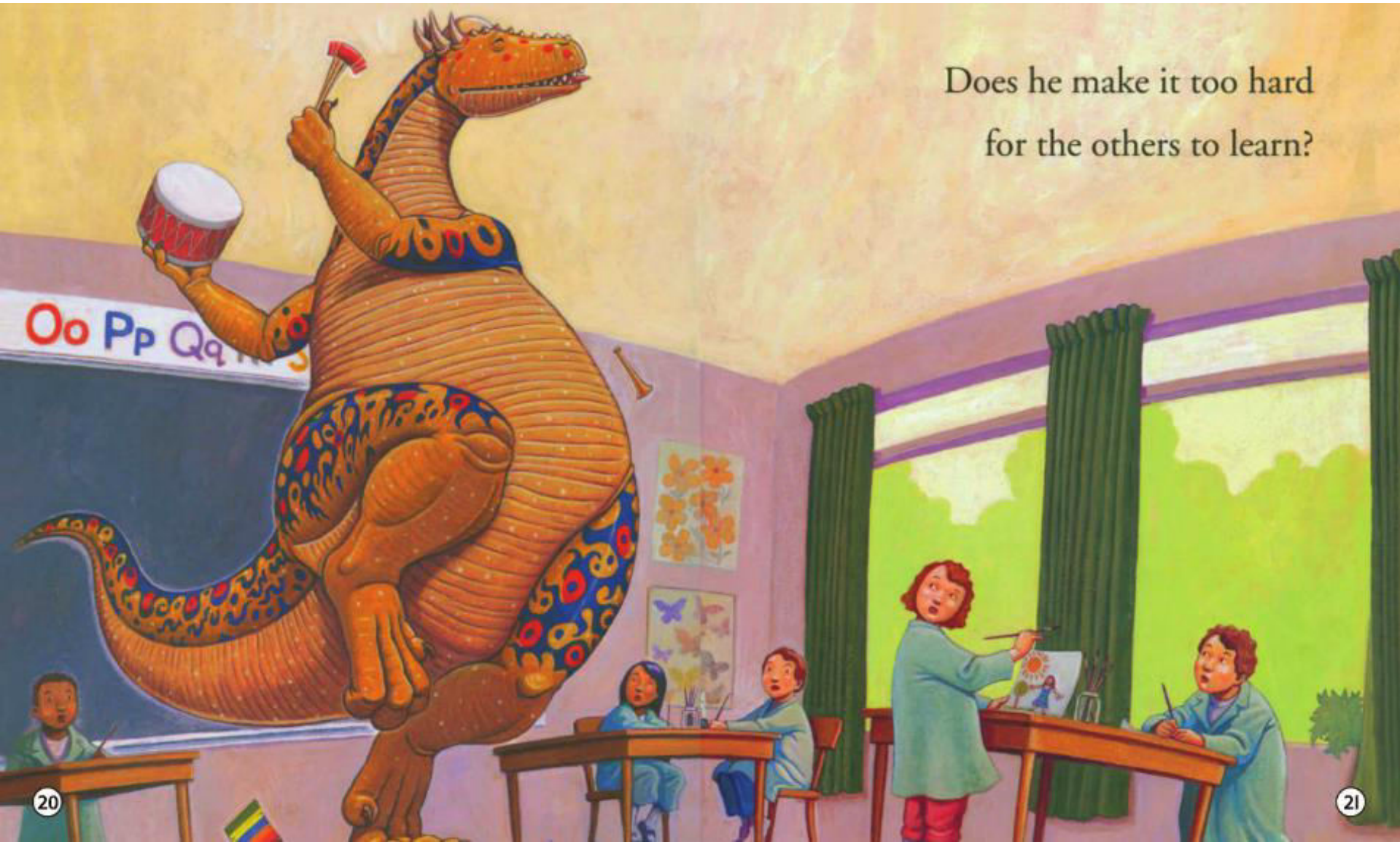




And when in the classroom,

or roar out of turn?



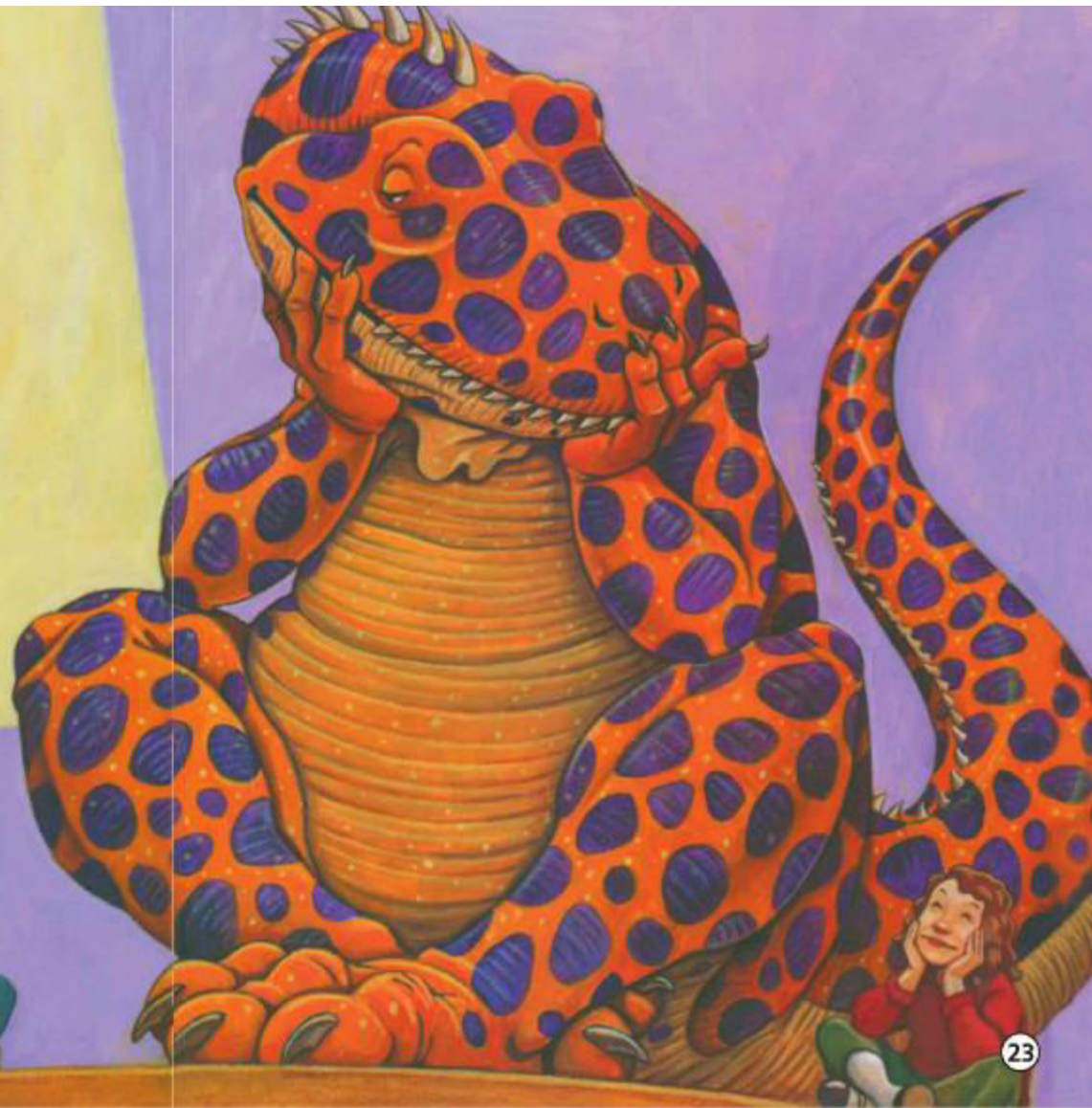


Does he make it too hard

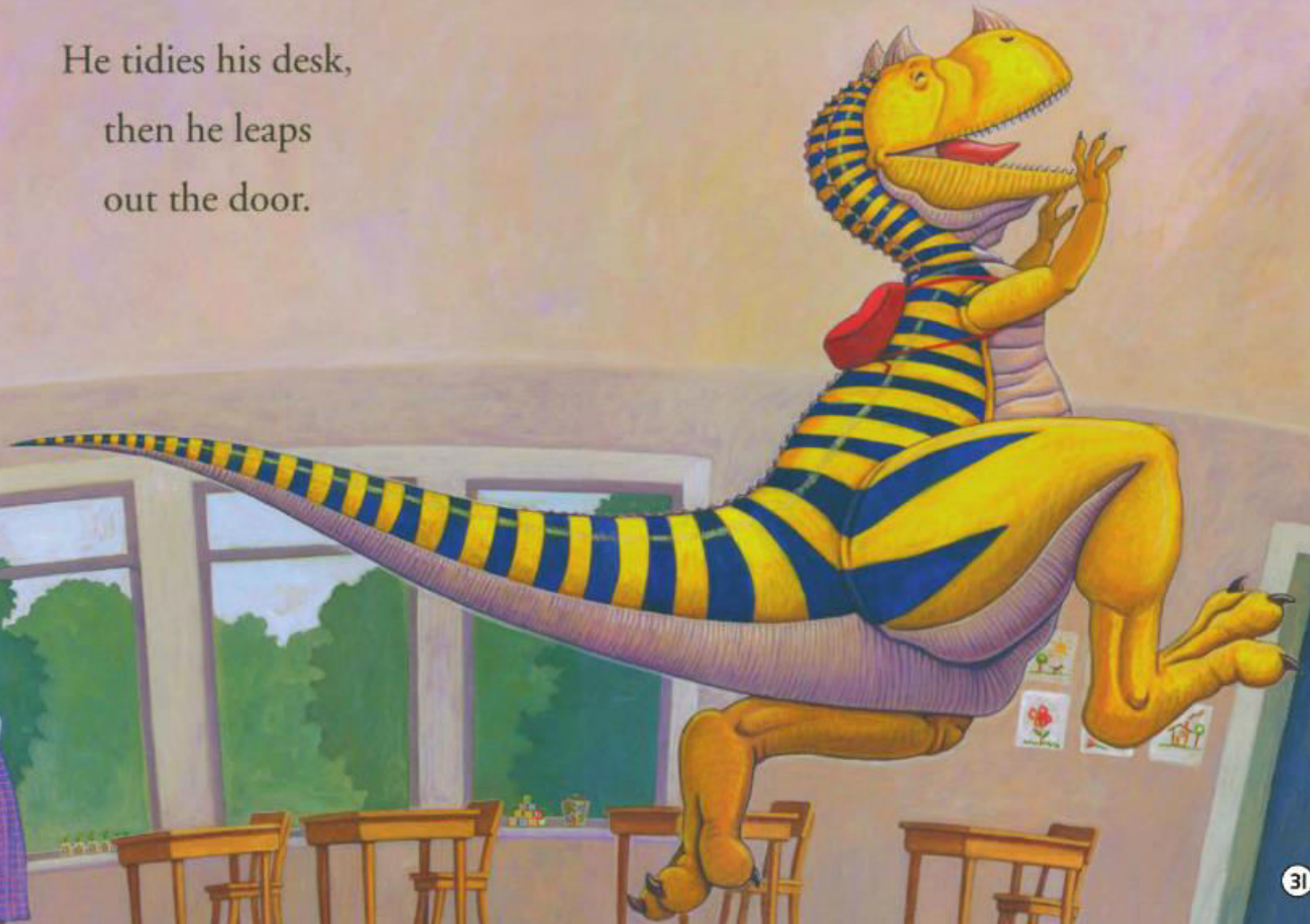


DEVINGAKIPTERUS

# Be Safe!



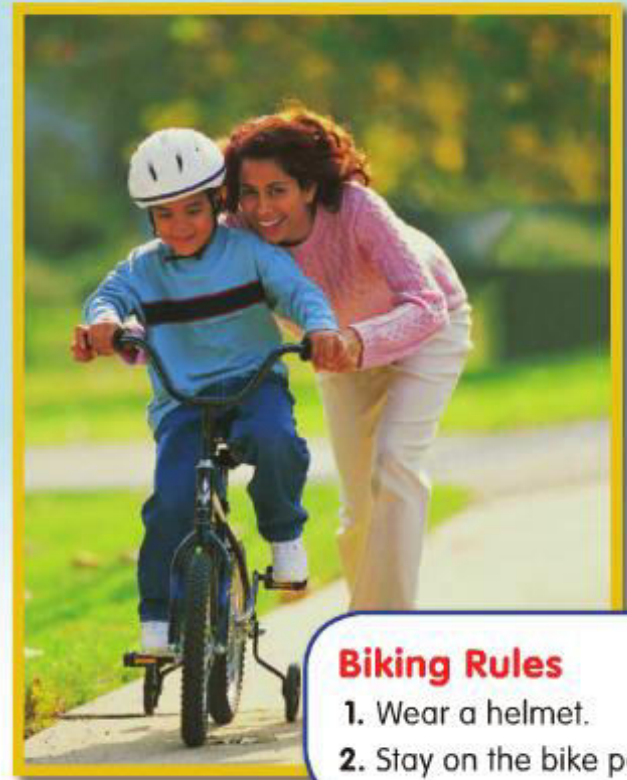
## Walking Rules
