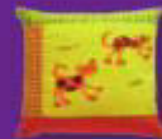

triangles all around.

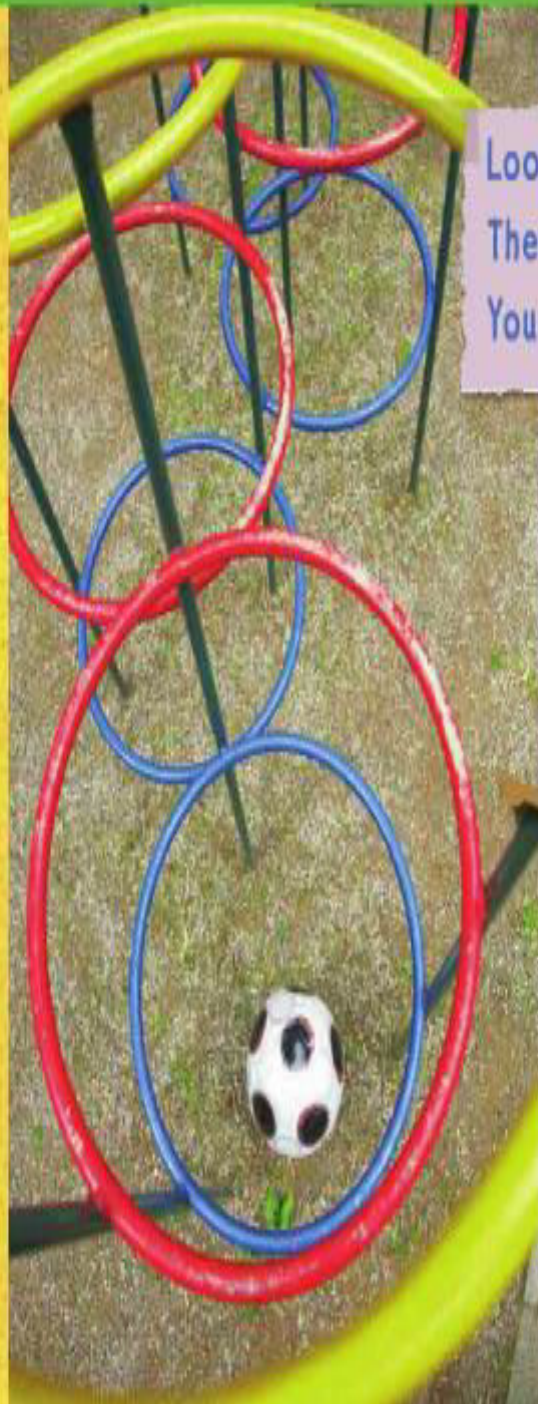
Find the shapes I drew on

Play with circles!

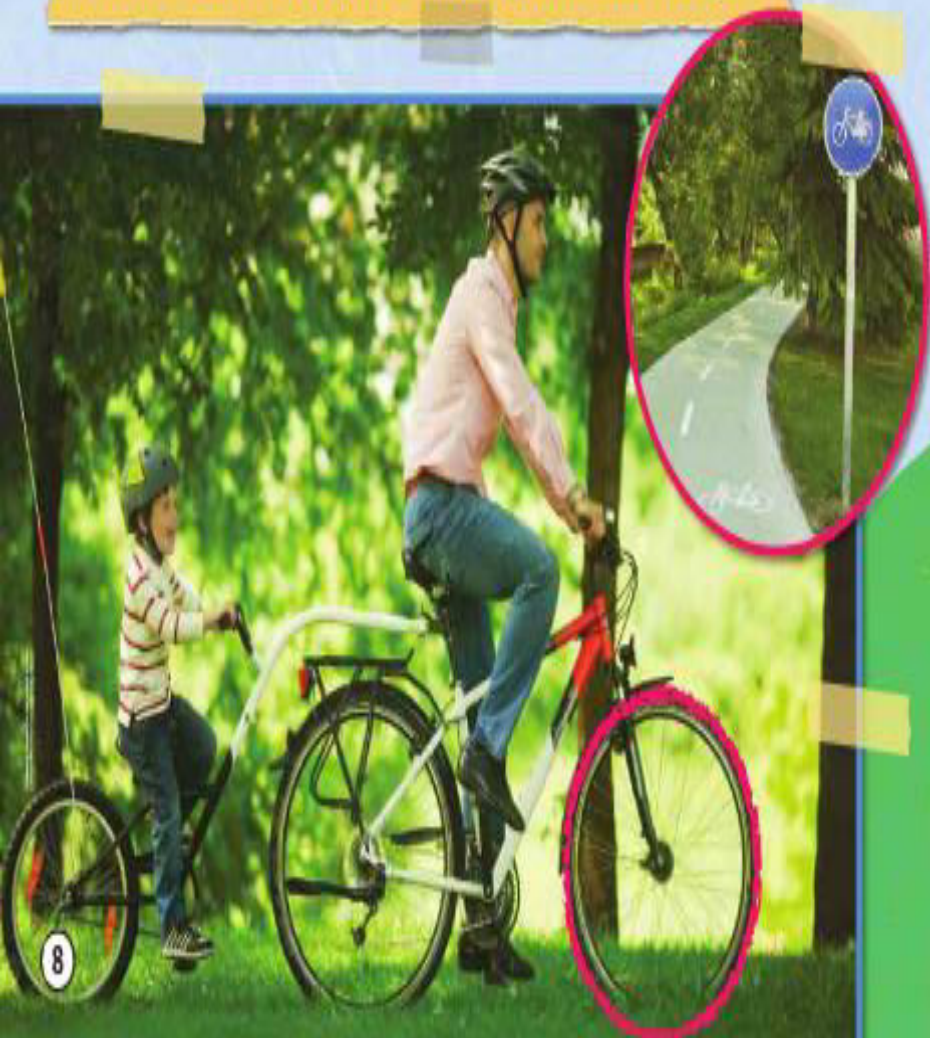


Look at these rings.

The soccer field is a big rectangle.

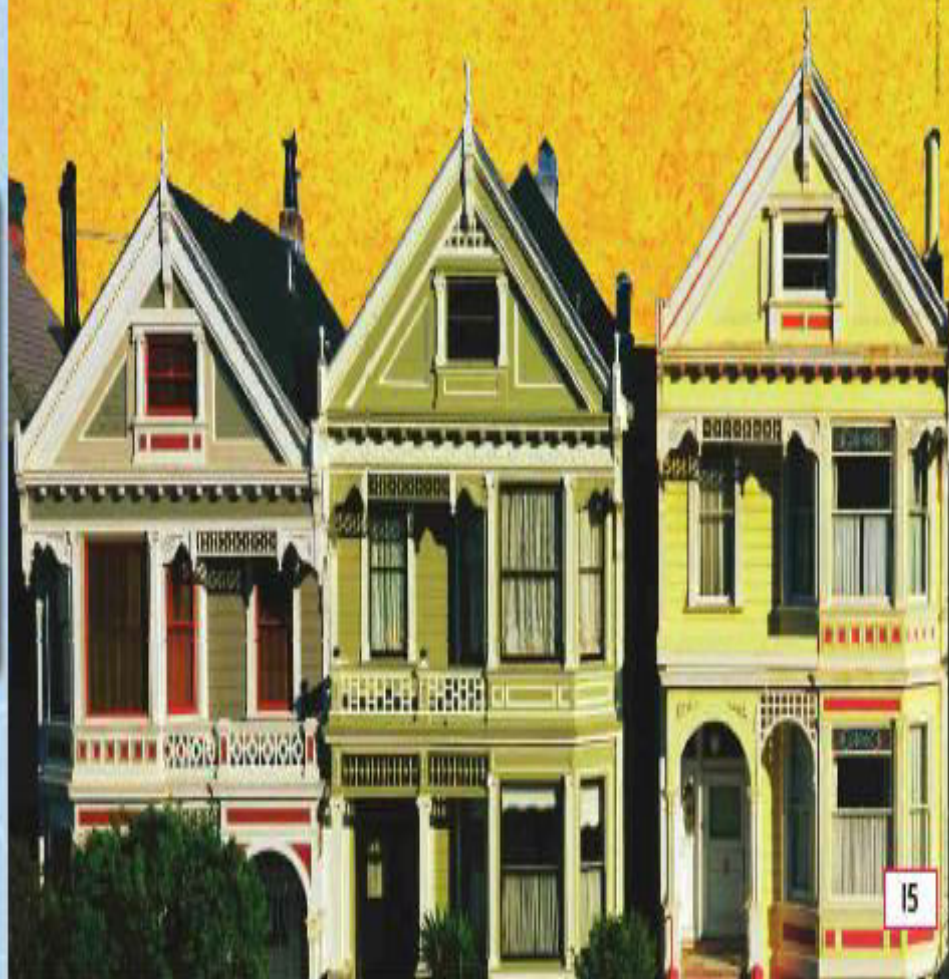
There are smaller rectangles on the field, too.

This rectangle rules!

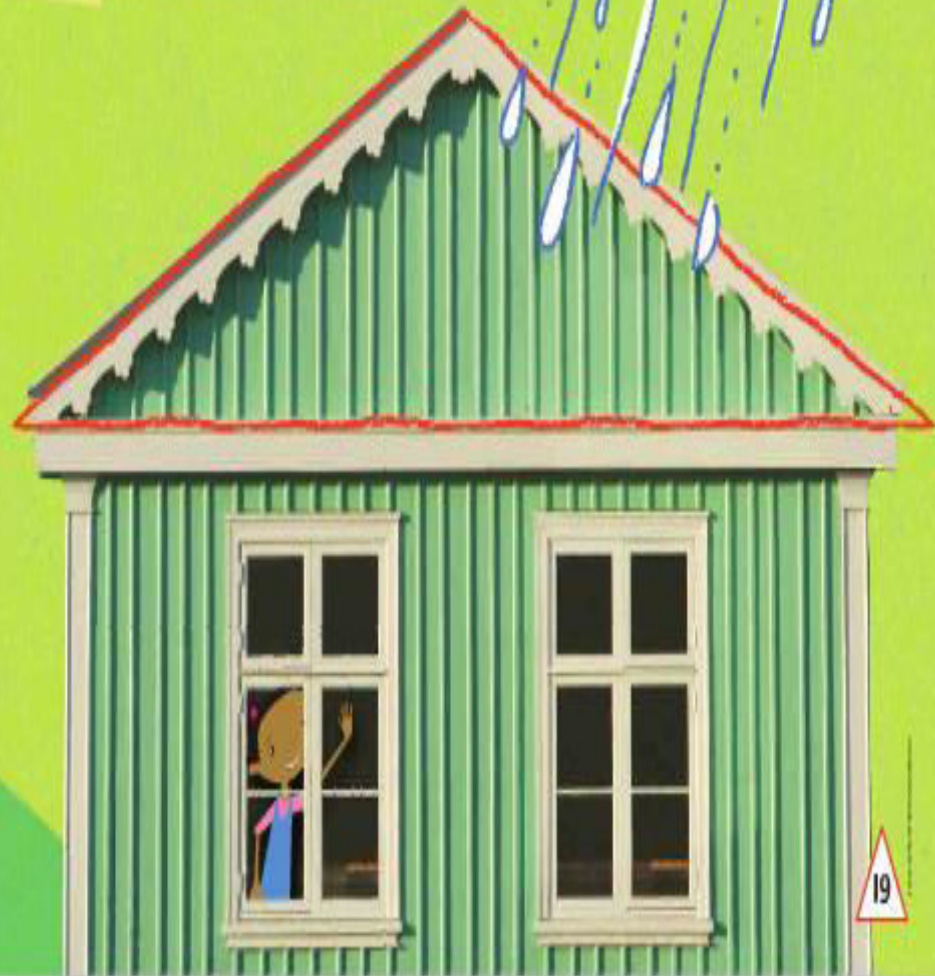


▲ Triangles

Then eat them all up!

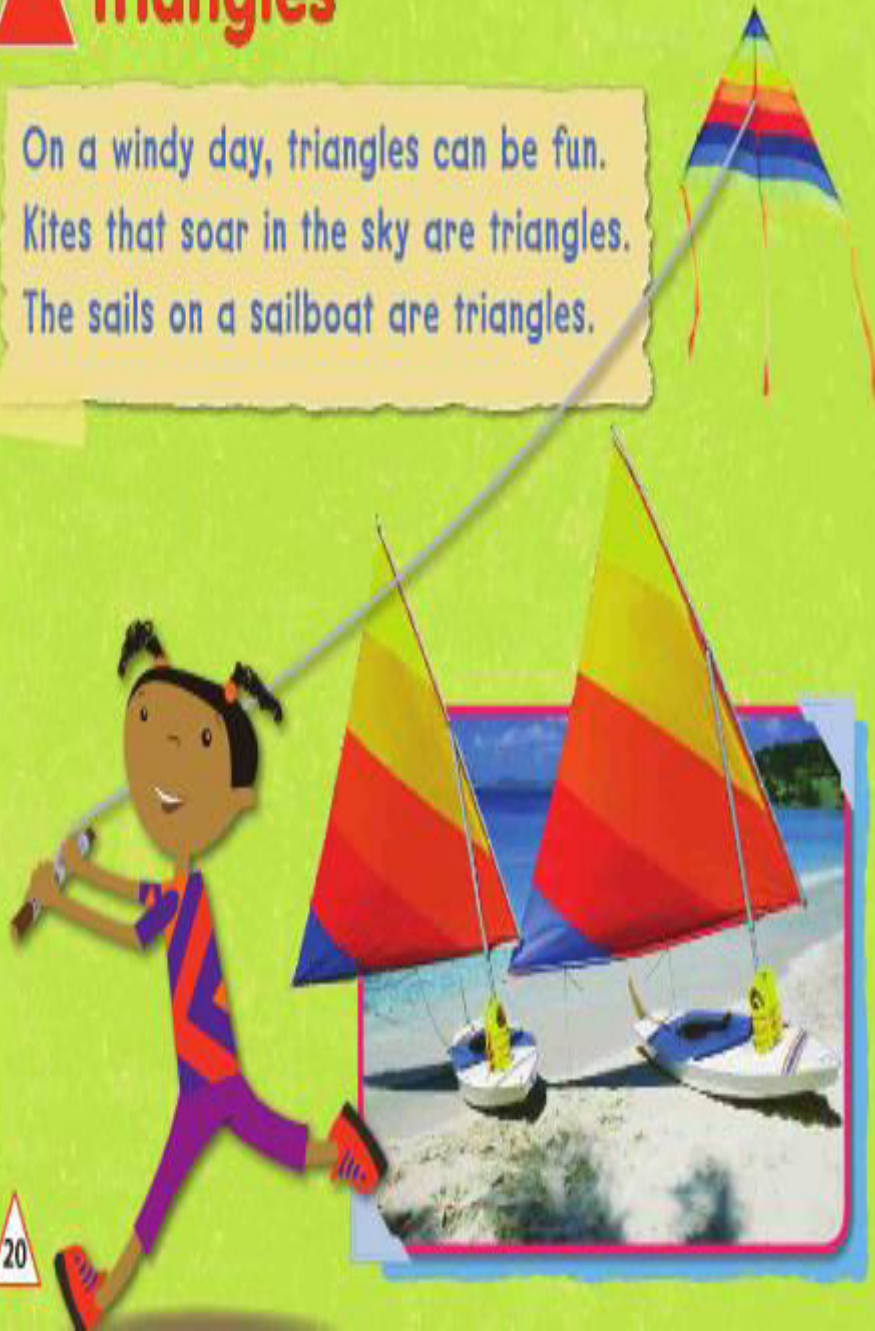


Many roofs are triangles.

The signs tell drivers to be careful.



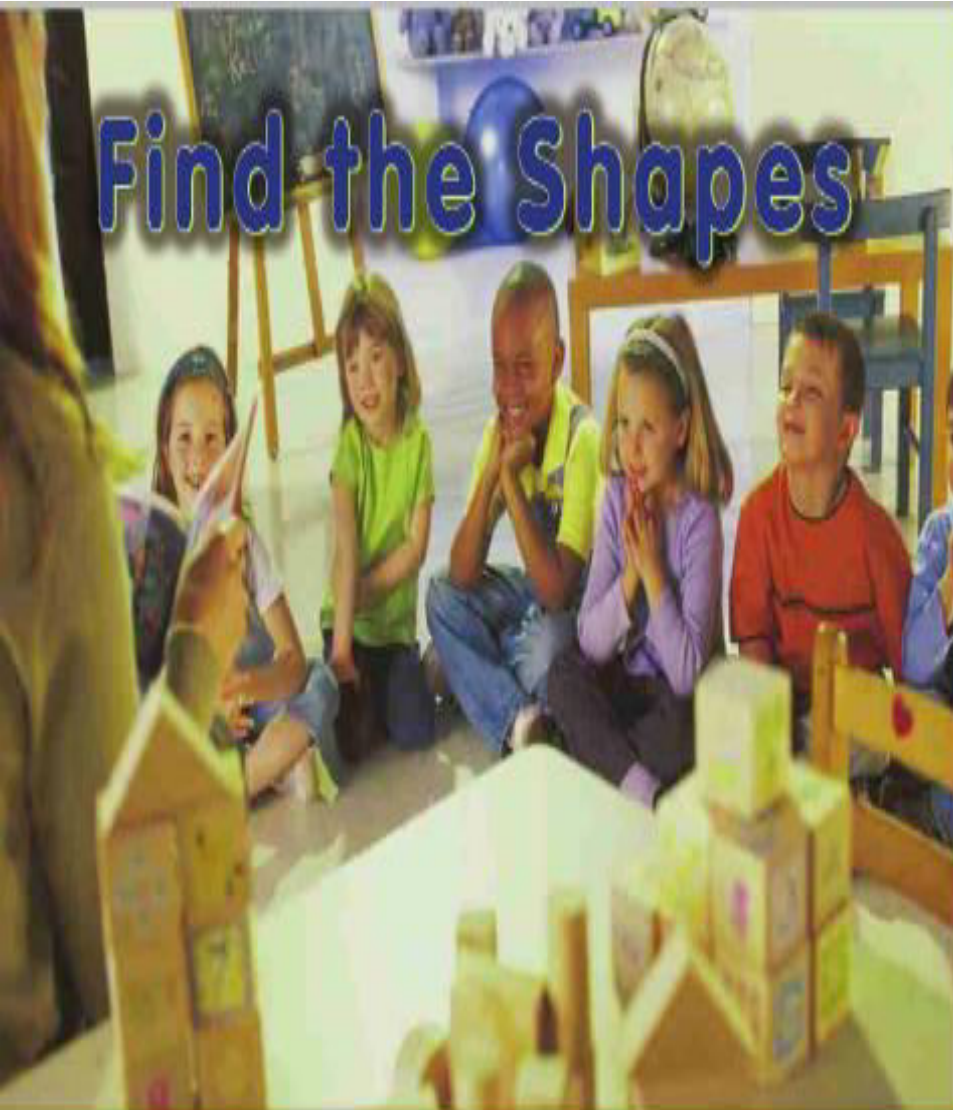
Shapes Within Shapes
